parency. This in turn leads to increased intimacy with God and others, which in turn leads to a more pure worship, which in turn leads to greater joy and enhanced fellowship. The collective fruit of this worship and fellowship is properly experienced or expressed as love—pure, unadulterated, unconditional love.

God's desire for you and all you know is to experience His love in an unadulterated way. He uses people like you and me as agents to express His love. Sin creates a bottleneck in the process. Therefore, brokenness over sin—that which stops the flow of God's love—is the prerequisite of experiencing God's love. God uses you to express His love to me and to others. Also, He uses me to express His love to you and to others.

How can we keep God's love flowing through us? The answer is brokenness—

brokenness over sin and its effects in me and through me to others. In another Psalm David asked God to search him. He didn't trust himself with that exacting task. He, like us, was too prone to excuse sin rather

than forsake it.

This whole search and destroy process of dealing with sin can be expressed in a simple phrase: roof off, walls down. "Roof off" refers to our relationship with God. There is nothing hidden between us and God. "Walls down" refers to our relationship with one another. There is nothing hidden nor hindering our relationship with one another. In short, we are transparent. We have no secret sin, no hidden agenda, nothing between our soul and our Savior.

When the church of Jesus Christ experiences and expresses love at this level, revival will soon follow, Jesus will be glorified and sinners will be converted. That's my hearts prayer for today. I'll see you Sunday: "roof off, walls down."

My life has been recently enriched by a young man, graduating from high school and going into the music ministry. He is not a member of our church, but, because of our common love for worship, our paths have crossed and he has participated in worship with us on several occasions.

He is extremely gifted- his voice and natural musicianship is one of kind. His stage presence is an incredible blend of confidence and sincerity. At his young age, he knows the difference between entertaining a crowd and leading them in worship and he strives to do the later.

That has, honestly, impressed me. But that is not what has enriched me.

What has enriched me is how he behaves off-stage. He is one of the most positive, upbeat people I know. A true Barnabas with a servant's heart: He is constantly on the prowl for those needing an encouraging word, a smile, a hug, whatever. When he finds one in need, I have watched him from a distance respond without hesitation, to the saved and unsaved, boys and girls, the popular and the discarded. While most his age are seeking affirmation and gratification, he seems to thrive on affirming and serving.

And I am now part of his ministry.

Every morning, with rare exception (and always with apology), this young man texts me (and who knows how many others) a devotion- complete with scripture, some thoughts, and even an application ("today I want you to...."). With no applause, no spotlight and no prodding this young man has found a unique way to encourage his brothers and sisters. The devotions are teen focused, but well-thought out and reeking in sincere love and desire for the growth of others. What started out as an amusing curiosity to me is now a high point of my morning.

And more than the quality of the words is the condition of the heart. This is true worship leading: encouraging the hearts of others so that they may be inspired towards unity and good works for a great King. His simple, unselfish act of concern for my spiritual growth has spurred me on. I so hope and pray, that you feel the same thing each and every time you leave one of our worship service. As one of our deacons is very fond of saying, "may I be a blessing to others, as they are blessing me".
